I would like to mention some advantages of having a dog park:

- Off-leash dog parks, provide a community setting which people can gather socialize
- Promotes responsible pet ownership and the enforcement of dog-control laws
- Studies have shown that people find it easier to talk to each other with dogs as the initial focus, breaking down the usual social barrier that make people in society perceive others as strangers
- Separate play spaces for large and small dogs

While planning a dog park I will research what is needed and speak to Caroline Spark for guidance. A list of necessary items needed for a dog park is:

❖ 4' to 6' fence

- separate, double gated entry and exit points
- adequate drainage
- parking close to park
- * water
- bags to dispose of animal waste in covered trash cans
- * regular maintenance and cleaning of the grounds (those you use the park regularly will be guardians making sure park is maintained.

I have spoken to eight Yachats citizens that own small dogs that have shown great enthusiasm about creating a dog park. There are areas behind the Commons that rarely are used for the original purpose when they were created. I live behind the boardwalk and rarely to I hear a horse shoe hitting the post.
