Mayor's Message

Let me begin this month's message by thanking those of you who attended the City's "Annual Update Event/State of the City." It is one of the best opportunities I have during the year to sum up all that is going on, using the language of the State Ordinance, to report to the Council (and to the citizens) the "financial and otherwise" condition of the City, and to "recommend such measures for the peace, health, improvement, and prosperity, which I, as Mayor, deem expedient. So the talk was a bit of objective reporting and a bit of subjective deeming, and I think it went pretty well.

One important reality we celebrated on that day was our City's gratefulness to all our volunteers, who in so many different ways make Yachats as vibrant as it is. We gave ourselves a standing ovation. Last month's Spring Arts and Crafts Fair, The Ladies' Club Crafts Bazaar, and the Lions Breakfast moved us into what is often called The Tourist Season, the six-month period which ends with the Mushroom Festival in October. Almost the very center point of the season is the La De Da Parade. This is the time of year when volunteers are most needed. That means each of who are able are invited to connect with some event that needs help. I think no one will find much difficulty in discovering a job that is really needed. If you are at a loss in finding your niche, check with the City, the Chamber of Commerce, YYFAP, the Yachats Library, the Trails Committee, etc., etc. It might make your summer a lot more enjoyable and fulfilling.

You may have heard that we had (what I think) to be a productive meeting with the County Board of Commissioners at their annual visit to Yachats on March 14. We got positive news about the future Yachats-to-Florence bus service, ODOT's announcing their readiness to begin the Pollinator Habitat Restoration Project, and the beginning of making affordable/workforce housing more possible. It seems like we will be able to find our way to meet this important challenge.

Finally, a wish that those citizens who are now celebrating Passover and Easter will have a richly rewarding experience.

Dave Buckwald and I have drafted plans for a pad and three-sided structure per Dahl's specifications for our trash cans. It will be completed as soon as weather permits. An Insta-Hot water heater has been installed in the Women's bathroom. The glass in the door at the 501 Building has been replaced.

We have a structural engineer coming to assess issues in the Commons, the 501 Building, and the current Library building.

Concerning Right-of-Ways, Public Works would like you to know the Code:

Section 7.20.040 City permission requirement.

No person may occupy or encroach on a public right-of-way without the permission of the City. The City grants permission to use rights-of-way by franchises, licenses and permits. (Ord. 189 § 4, 1997)

Section 7.20.050 Obligations of the City.

The exercise of jurisdiction and regulatory control over a public right-of-way by the City is not official acceptance of the right-of-way, and does not obligate the City to maintain or repair any part of the right-of-way. (Ord. 189 § 5, 1997)
