

Code Enforcement Report

I testified before the House Rules Committee on behalf of House Bill 2208. Two other Code Enforcement Officers also testified. I heard on March 30th that the House Rules Committee had passed HB 2208 with a Do Pass Recommendation. HB 2208 now goes to the full House.
