There is an empty lot on Hill Ct. which is being overtaken by scotch broom, and has now gone to seed. The lot is owned by an out of towner, and is listed by Windemere (I think). This is the 2nd or 3rd year this has happened. Don is aware of the problem, and has contacted the owner by mail. Apparently he won't have the lot mowed, and I'm not sure what Windemere's responsibility is, but someone needs to get it done. With the emphasis on ridding the area of invasive species, and the number of articles devoted to it in newsletters, I find it somewhat contradictory that nothing has been done. The homeowners on Hill Ct. work to keep this kind of stuff out of our yards. If the city or realtor is not capable of taking care of this issue, or doesn't want to, that's fine, but don't put anymore articles about invasive species in your newsletters, as they won't be taken seriously.
