Minutes

The April meeting of the Yachats Planning Commission was called to order by Chair Katherine Guenther at 3:00 p.m. in the Civic Meeting room of the Yachats Commons. Members present: Guenther, Christine Orchard, Nan Scott, Ken Aebi, Lawrence Musial and Helen Anderson. Also present, City Planner Larry Lewis. Audience – 4.

IV. Public Hearings – Proposed Amendments to Title 9 Zoning & Land Use Code

A. Chapter 9.56 Partitions and Subdivisions – Proposed amendments to Performance Agreement provisions

Lewis explained the changes the Planning Commission is proposing regarding performance agreements, which more clearly define requirement.

Guenther opened the public testimony portion of the hearing. There was no testimony. Guenther closed the public hearing.

Commissioners made two minor changes in the proposed wording:

G. 2. Changing *subdivider* to *applicant*

G. 6. Changing *When* developer fails to *If* developer fails

Motion to recommend the amending language to City Council for adoption, Aye – 6, No – 0.

B. Chapter 9.60 Planned Unit Development (PUD) – Proposed amendments to uses permitted, minimum PUD size, density, exceptions, review procedures, preliminary approvals, and development requirements

Lewis explained the changes the Planning Commission is proposing regarding planned unit developments.

Guenther opened the public testimony portion of the hearing. There was a question regarding the minimum lot size, however there was no testimony. Guenther closed the public hearing.

1 Musial said that if the Planning Commission requires parks and open spaces but does not
2 accept responsibly or ownership of that park or open space after completion it leaves the
3 Homeowners Association responsible for that space.

4
5 Lewis said that the open space is typically for the benefit of the homeowners and it is stated so
6 in the Findings and Conditions when the PUD is approved.

7
8 The Commission Members agreed that if there is a condition placed on the development that
9 the open space be dedicated public use, the responsible party should also be included in the
10 Findings and Conclusions when the PUD is approved.

11
12 The Commissioners made some minor changes.

13
14 Motion to recommend the amending language to City Council for adoption, Aye – 6, No – 0.

16 **C. Chapter 9.52.030.B – Proposed deletion of this section so as to not conflict with**
17 **Section 9.68.060 Recreational Vehicles**

19 Lewis explained the changes the Planning Commission is proposing regarding Recreational
20 Vehicles.

22 Guenther opened the public testimony portion of the hearing. There were some general
23 questions about the notice that had been mailed to all property owners in town, and the reason
24 for deleting the section that had been Guenther closed the public hearing.

26 Motion to recommend the amending language of Sections 9.68.060 and 9.52.030, as discussed
27 today, Aye – 6, No – 0.

29 **D. Chapter 9.04 Definitions and 9.28 C-1 Retail Commercial Zone – mobile vending**
30 **units provisions are proposed to be added.**

32 Lewis explained the Planning Commission is proposing adding language regarding mobile
33 vending units to the current City Code.

35 Guenther opened the public testimony portion of the hearing. There was no testimony. Guenther
36 closed the public hearing.

38 Lewis explained that the Commissioners made several minor changes in the proposed wording
39 at the last work session to further clarify the language.

41 Motion to recommend the amending language to City Council for adoption, Aye – 6, No – 0.
